INVENTORY
Are there piles of inventory lying around?

If your materials and support equipment need to travel from central storage areas to your machines, lean thinking toward material processing can improve flow.

If you have to go on a data hunt to figure out how your facility is performing, or if you have to wait until finance “closes” the books to see how you did against your targets, you could benefit greatly from an improved Visual Management & Control System.
